

Wunya is a Yuggera word that means welcome/greetings.

Wunya will be a collaborative event for the First Nations Employee Network focusing on cultural self-care, connecting with communities across the state and yarning about your experiences within the community legal sector.

Wednesday, 31 July from 9:00am to 4:00pm with optional social event from 4pm to 6:00pm

Thursday, 1 August from 9:00am to 1:30pm with optional afternoon session to 3pm.

Where: Events on Oxlade, 50 Oxland Drive, New Farm (Meanjin/Brisbane)

Who is this event for?

First Nations employees working in a Queensland community legal centre. It doesn't matter what your job title is CEO, lawyer, social worker, youth worker, intake officer or anything else. Everyone is welcome.

Social Event

How to get there:

Events on Oxlade is easily accessible by City Cat or the 196 Bus. Plan your journey on Translink

Free parking is available at the venue or in the surrounding streets.

Accommodation Options within walking distance

<u>Kirribilli Apartments</u> – 150 Oxlade Drive, New Farm (7 minute walk to/from venue)

Edward Lodge - 75 Sydney St, New Farm (9 minute walk to/from venue)

There are also many accommodation options in the Valley and the CBD – the venue is accessible via the 196 bus route or the City Cat Ferry (New Farm Park Ferry Terminal).

Travel Subsidies

Thanks for project funding for this event – this year we are able to offer generous travel subsidies for those coming from outside the Greater Brisbane area.

Travel subsidies for this event are available per person, not per centre.

Option 1: Flights and Accommodation

Community Legal Centres Queensland will pay up to \$1000 per person towards the costs of flights and accommodation.

Option 2: Driving and Accommodation

Community Legal Centres Queensland will pay up to \$600 per person towards the costs of accommodation, driving and parking.

Information about how to claim your travel subsidy will be distributed via email closer to the event date.

FAQs about Travel Subsidies

What about meals or incidentals? The travel subsidy only covers travel and accommodation. Most centres have policies around travel allowances or per diem payments which can be used to cover meals and expense not covered by the Wunya Travel Allowance.

Morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea as well as some food at the social event will be supplied each day as part of the event.

What if my travel costs more or less than the subsidy? You can only claim up to the travel allowances as listed above or the amount you have spent. For example, Under Option 1, if your expenses total \$1094, you can apply for \$1000 but if your expenses total \$876, you can only apply for \$876.
