Travel Subsidies

Thanks to project funding for this event – this year we are able to offer generous travel subsidies for those coming from outside the Greater Brisbane area.

Travel subsidies for this event are available per person, not per centre. Everyone who has to travel is eligible.

Option 1: Flights and Accommodation

Community Legal Centres Queensland will pay **up to \$1000 per person** towards the costs of flights and accommodation.

Option 2: Driving and Accommodation

Community Legal Centres Queensland will pay **up to \$600 per person** towards the costs of accommodation, driving and parking.

FAQs about Travel Subsidies

What about meals or incidentals? The travel subsidy only covers travel and accommodation. Most centres have policies around travel allowances or per diem (daily) payments which can be used to cover meals and expense not covered by the Wunya Travel Allowance. Talk to your manager or HR about this.

Morning tea, lunch and afternoon tea will be supplied each day as part of the event, along with food at the social event.

What if my travel costs more or less than the subsidy? You can only claim up to the travel allowances as listed above or the amount you have spent. For example, Under Option 1, if your expenses total \$1094, you can apply for \$1000 but if your expenses total \$876, you can only apply for \$876.
